These “Heritage Artifacts” are very rare and very old. One of these sticks has been radiocarbon dated to a Median Age of 1764 while the other stick has been radiocarbon dated to a Median Age of 1839.

They were originally owned by one of the eight founding families of this area - Monckton/Moncton. The “Schantz (Anglicized to

The “Schantz/Jones Family” were “shipbuilders” and built nine large ships. They had the tools and the ability to “steam wood” for their ship production. The wood of the sticks has been traced back to one of three areas: Germany, Pennsylvania or this area of New Brunswick.



Jones) family left Germany and emigrated to Pennsylvania, US and then after working to pay off the costs of transportation from Germany to Pennsylvania, they continued their journey finally arriving in this area at the Bend in 1766. Through the George Washington Land Company of which Benjamin Franklin was a part, the “Schantz” family was given 2,163 acres in this area.

There has been other similar sticks but they are as common as “hen’s teeth”. The Moffatt Stick was sold to the Museum of Natural History in Quebec for **\$300,000**.

The Rutherford Stick was sold to a private Canadian Collector for \$2.2 Million USD, has been appraised today at **\$4.25 million** and sits in the Hockey Hall of Fame in Toronto.
